Hubrís or Humílíty?



Dearest sisters and brothers in Christ,

Today our focus is on humility. Have you felt yourself in the grips of hubris? It's rather easy to get caught up in what the world thinks of us. The need to establish oneself in relation to others often comes with the vitriol of hubris. May we lean toward the glory of our Lord to bring sense and perspective to the notion of thinking oneself too grand to need God's help.

Humility is a cornerstone of Christian virtue, a trait that God values deeply in His followers. It is a quality that embodies the acknowledgment of one's limitations and the recognition of the greatness of God. Humility involves a modest view of one's importance and a willingness to submit to God's will. We can learn much for Biblical readings. In fact, the Bible is replete with references and teachings that illustrate the significance of humility in the life of a believer.

"Be humbled in the sight of the Lord and He will raise you on high." James (4:10).

The Old Testament provides several profound examples of humility. One of the most notable is the story of Moses. Despite his significant role in leading the Israelites out of Egypt, Moses is described as the humblest man on earth. Numbers 12:3 states, "Now Moses was a very humble man, humbler than anyone else on the face of the earth." His humility was evident in his reliance on God for guidance and his reluctance to assume leadership without divine assurance.

Philippians 2:5-8 beautifully encapsulates this, stating, **"In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus.**

Take the time to engage someone in conversation, take a moment to smile and recognize a stranger, call your parents and tell them that you love them, give thanks to your friends who check in on you to see how life is treating you.
